Mayor Mark Smith called the Regular Council Meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. by roll call. City Council Members in attendance: Mayor Pro Tem Cara McFerren, Councilmember Josh Shiltz, Councilmember Tim Parizek, Councilmember Omar Martinez, and Councilmember Dana Dominguez. The City Council approved the consent agenda. Shiltz/McFerren (5-0)

Reports: City Engineer Leo Foley communicated the sewer service discussions with City Manager Geertz for the annexation of Wiele Chevrolet Inc. In 2007, the City took the sewer up to Walnut, but there will need to be a lift station or grinder system to allow Wiele Chevrolet to connect to the sewer system. Foley communicated that the Wastewater Baseline Improvements will be looked at to phase them out with the most important needs happening first. Foley communicated that Well #2 is in place and the roof has been completed and just needs final leak testing.

City Manager Geertz communicated that there was a Utility Committee Meeting to look over Electric Superintendent applications and interviews were held on March 04th, 2024.

There was a Public Hearing on the proposed zoning changes to the west side of N Elm St. to R-2 and C-2.

The Public Hearing was opened by roll call vote. McFerren/Dominguez Shiltz-Y, Parizek-Y, Martinez-Y, Dominguez-Y, McFerren-Y (5-0)

During the public comments section of the public hearing, community members on N. Elm St. brough up concerns they had on switching the zoning from M-2 Heavy Industrial to C-2 General Retail District. City Manager Geertz communicated that the construction that has happened on N. Elm St. has not followed an M-2 Zoning and the City of West Liberty is attempting to correct the section based on what is currently there. To unify the zoning on N. Elm St. City Building Inspector Terry Goerdt communicated that the items in the zoning that are not a true C-2 would be non-conforming and as long as there was not a lapse in time of more than a year of operation, the businesses could continue to function as they are today despite the zoning change. The zoning changes should have been completed during the construction periods of the items that are on N. Elm St., but now the City needs to correct the zoning and have it fall in line with the Comprehensive Plan for the City.

There was a Public Hearing on the proposed zoning changes for the annexation of Wiele Chevrolet Inc. just west of the corporate City limits from Agricultural to C-2.

During the public comments section of the public hearing, City Manager communicated that when a property is annexed it comes in as Agricultural and this is just changing the zoning to meet the code for the existing property.

The first reading of Ordinance 20240305-06: An Ordinance Amending the City of West Liberty Zoning Map to Establish the Zoning of a Parcel of Land belonging to Wiele Chevrolet Inc. from the Current Zoning Classification of A-1, Agricultural District to C-2, General Retail District was approved by roll call vote. Vendor Voucher Claims List #1 in the amount of \$455,089.36 was approved. McFerren/Dominguez (5-0)

During the Public Comment Section: There were no public comments from the community. Councilmember Dominguez communicated that a community member reached out to inquire about Solar Power in the City of West Liberty. Dominguez communicated that she knows the City has had preliminary discussions and wants to make sure that this stays on the radar. Mayor Pro Tem McFerren communicated that the City will continue to work on this when the Electric Superintendent is in place.
